- Call meeting to order
- John Mullins from Safety and Security will be present to discuss a drop-off and pick-up zone
 - Parking situation is not ideal but looks much like other schools since school was built so long ago.
 - Parking safety is a concern.
 - Parking solutions: look at the signage, and parking enforcement
 - As a resource: Getting to School Safely DVD on DPS website [Getting to School Safely Link](#)
 - Kiss and Go program has been very successful at other schools with around 500 kids
 - Kiss and go is a proposed solution for Asbury, buses will stay where they are
 - Considering a parking side on the East Side and on the West Side, a Kiss and Go Program
 - parents get placard and kid gets one with matching number for their backpack
 - staff helps kids get into cars, parents stay in car
 - signage may change from Asbury to Evans to 30 minute parking, no passenger loading on the east side
 - could have 5th grade students help load and unload
 - logistics still need to be figured out:
 - bus kids will continue to go out the front door, still need to figure out how to get students to different areas
 - when will this program start? post spring break or fall-csc recommends piloting this program in April
