Principal's Report

Principal Alicia FaJohn reported:

- Welcome back! We are excited for another school year. Back to School Night was a great success. Thank you for coming!
- The first CSC (Collaborative School Committee) meeting was today. The CSC discusses high level operational matters such as budget, staffing, unified improvement plans and meets in the library once a month right before the PTSO meeting. Sara Hogan provides childcare.
- As we are combing through data, we have three main goals as a school for the year:
 - To focus on rigorous tasks. How are we engaging our critical thinkers?
 - To look at descriptive feedback. How do we give feedback to our students? How are they growing and what can the next steps be?
 - To continue culturally responsive teaching practices.
- As a staff we are doing a book study: Culturally Responsive Teaching and the Brain: Promoting Authentic Engagement and Rigor Among Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Students by Zaretta Hammond. Extra copies are available if you would like to borrow a copy. It is about making connections and building relationships with children.
- School data has come in. This information will be presented in November.
- In terms of numbers, there is a decline in enrollment in DPS. We are seeing families moving out of the district. Projected enrollment was at 335 students. We are currently at 327. The budget for this school year bas based on 335 students, so we are below the numbers projected (approximately \$5000 per student). We planned well knowing that this was coming so we should be OK in the long run. September 12th is the school district count day. At this point we will have a really good idea of what our numbers look like. Because we are a smaller school, we will feel the impact of this decline in enrollment.

Teacher's Report

2019-20 Fundraising Goals

Direct Give & Celebration Run

- Lizzy Neufeld spoke about this year's Direct Give campaign. The campaign started last year in response to parents asking for a way to give directly to the school.
- Our goal is to raise money so that our school can go above and beyond what it already does. Alicia's vision is coming into place the pieces that have been worked on over the past couple of years are coming together. The district falls short in serving every child and meeting every child where they are at. The PTSO has taken on the task of closing that gap.
- The campaign will launch on the Monday after Carnival (September 23rd).
- There will be a push for monthly donations. We are approximately \$850 short per student throughout the building. If every family could donate \$75 per month per child we could make up for this deficit. We are hoping this option will be attractive to people. We understand this is not something every family will be able to do.
- Donations are 100% tax deductible.
- Each class (or grade) will have online fundraising pages with goals. You will be able to send these links to friends and family so that they can learn about what is going on in our classrooms.
- We will be asking teachers to participate so that we can have 100% participation. We would love to have this momentum, even if it is \$5 a month.
- We will celebrate the conclusion of the campaign with a Fun Run on October 17th to mimic Boosterthon.
- We have lofty goals we are hoping you can help and spread the word.
- We have a handful of immediate needs. We are looking for two people to help set up classroom pages. This can mostly be done at home. It will include interviewing the teachers to understand what their classroom story is. We are also looking for someone to help plan the Fun Run (logistics, supplies, music) as well as a volunteer to help collate and put together packets for distribution. Another need is a social media savvy person to help with writing posts. Another piece is that we are looking for families to host small group gatherings ideally one household per grade. Teachers and leadership come and share at these events so that our families can learn about what we are raising

money for, how we are meeting needs and how we are going above and beyond. These 1-hour to 1-1/2-hour gatherings will take place between our kick-off in September and wrap-up in October.

Treasurer's Report

- We will be writing a \$105,000 check to the school soon.
- Our Chook Dine Out in May brought in \$250.
- Our Papa John's Dine Out in May brought in \$209.
- Our August Kona Ice fundraiser brought in \$154.80.
- Our number of individual memberships is a little higher than it was this time last year. Sign up if you have not yet!
- A parent asked what our goal is for the year. Alicia explained that we are waiting for numbers to settle. \$100,000 to \$120,000 funds everything we have in existence now (including full-time PE, full-time Art, health tech, full-time tech teacher). We are going to have to raise our goals moving forward because the school budget will have to cover the teacher salary shift from approximately \$77,000 to \$84,000.
