She is working with the Project Based Learning and one way to do that is to tie it into science and social studies. Karen wasn't able to do that with her kids. The when they flood into 2nd and 3rd, they have a large class size. Some of it seemed to affect their community.
- Moving forward they would probably do science and social studies differently. That would mean those students would have to loop the next year to do all the content needed.
- Based on curriculum next year, we cannot do a <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> split.
