Q - Can teachers organize to write letters or contact the school board to have schools held harmless to their budgets. Main point - If teachers are cut then they will look at other districts and might not come back.

A - Emily asked Amy to look to the union to see what our rights are around contacting the board to voice our concerns.

Q - What is the district loss of students currently?

A - Does not know. They are struggling to get families to actually register.

Q - If DPS decides to make it a hold harmless is it a DPS decision or does CDE get involved.

A - DPS bases on numbers so DPS decision.

Q - Community Meeting last night? Did many people show up? Did you get much feedback?

A - Maybe 15 people. Asking about SPED, kinder and when we are coming back. Questions around classrooms. Alicia will send out the recording through a deet. Jeanna will host the next town hall meeting.

Q - Fundraising question from Lizzy - Strategically does it make sense to launch a fundraising campaign right now? Is there a call to action that is clear that we can utilize in our planning.

Kristi - Direct Give was the highest of what people would be willing to give to. Framing an SOS that we are in a crisis.

Marin - Families are struggling so we need to be careful around the wording and not making people feel guilty. Community feel or fundraising feel?

Lizzy - Need to do some repair and rebuilding of community before we do a big strong ask.

Emily - Maybe the message is around gratitude for choosing Asbury even in the most difficult times. What can we do for you? Now we are asking what you can do for us?

Leah - Fun Run - focusing more on the community building but it will have a fundraising component too.

Kristi - If we don't give people the real truth, then they won't know. All dependent on the district decisions. If we get to the moment where we have to lose staff, then the truth around the issues is important to message.

Alicia - We have to move forward and be methodical and keep going.

Karen - Maybe it is not the year to push so hard and so fast, but it is an ongoing fundraising process instead so it is more manageable.
